Executive Director, Hugh Lim 2023 saw the full resumption of international travel and in-person events, which began with the World Cities Summit 2022 in August last year. We resumed our in-person CLC Lecture Series as well, welcoming over 300 participants from the

public and private sectors to our first large-scale lecture on the 2050 Seoul Grand Plan in June. CLC's research work is now more futures-oriented, focusing on commonly faced urban issues like ageing populations, resilience for our built environments, and inclusivity in sustainable and liveable cities. This year, we organised our inaugural

Urban Science Workshop Series, convening international experts and researchers,

and Singapore agencies and research community, to share the application of scientific methods for better urban planning and governance. Another significant project was the completion of our groundbreaking Dementia-Friendly Neighbourhoods Study, the first community-based research study on inclusive environments for persons living with dementia in Singapore. The Research team also published the first edition of the International Journal on Smart and Sustainable Cities, a collaboration with the World Scientific Publishing Co., new issues in the Urban System Studies series, and our biannual Urban Solutions. We continued to cultivate deeper international partnerships through the signing of several Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with the Nusantara National Capital Authority (NNCA), ETH-Zurich, and Ramboll respectively, dedicated to mutual learning and knowledge exchange on topics related to urban planning

and governance. In 2023, we saw several tangible activities arising from our various MoUs, including workshops, study visits, and co-curated sessions at the Science of Cities Symposium. In September, CLC organised the 12th World Cities Summit (WCS) Mayors Forum in Seoul, the Lee Kuan Yew World City Prize 2018 Laureate. We hosted around 200 international participants, including 50 mayors and city leaders, and are pleased to report that the Forum continues to be a valuable platform for leaders to discuss urban challenges. We thank Seoul Mayor Oh Se-hoon and the Seoul Metropolitan Government for their contributions to the event's success.


