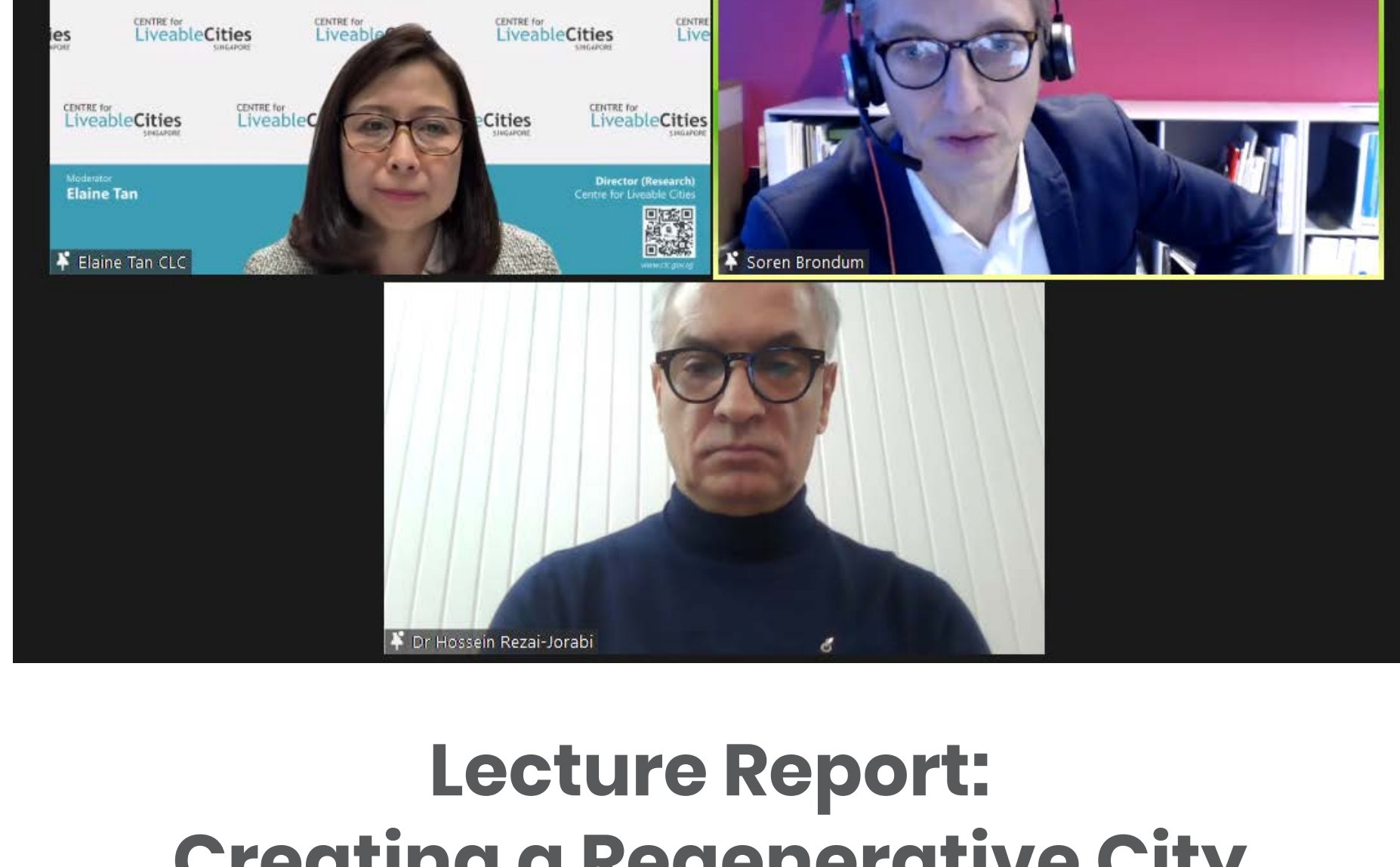
Enhancing Water Resilience through Integrated Water Management – Surat, India

Lecture Report: Creating a Regenerative City

Regenerative design is a promising approach to tackle the climate crisis, given the inadequacy of the sustainable pathway to limit global warming to the 1.5-degree target set out in the Paris Agreement.

Ramboll's Global Design Director, Dr Hossein Rezaei and Managing Director for Buildings, Mr. Søren Brøndum explained how regenerative design requires a multi-stakeholder approach, going beyond reducing carbon emissions to consider nature as a partner, inter-generational equity and resource circularity.

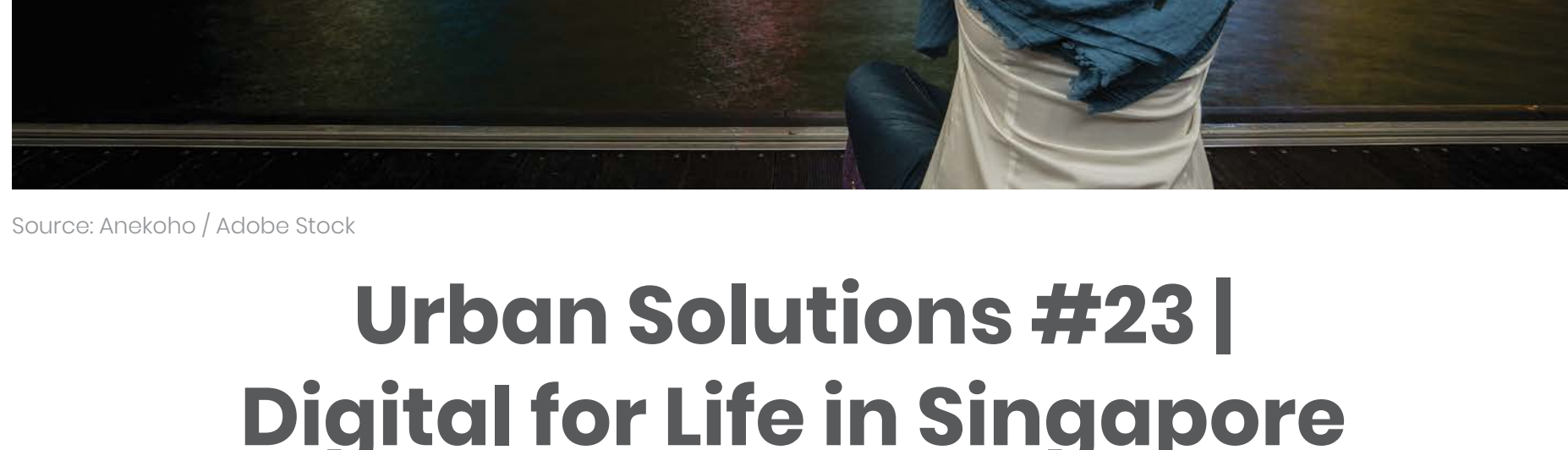
Lecture Report: Towards a more inclusive Singapore: Designing Dementia-Friendly Neighbourhoods
